The Bible | Thessalonians 5:16-18

1st - 6th

Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Happy Easter

This week we see the Passover of Christ, to the day he was treated brutally in cause of our sins, to the day he rose up from the dead to wash away our sins. On the day of the Passover, Jesus reminded us that even when he wasn't here we should be helping others and spreading his word. On Good Friday, we are reminded of all the bad deeds we have done and the cause of it all. To fulfil the scriptures, **Jesus rises from the dead** to say our sins are forgiven. This week is a week where we not only are able to see our sins, we are also able to be free from the burden it offers. We must thank God for not letting us fall into the abyss of our sins, for taking them away, and putting them on his only son Jesus. How hard it is for us to forgive the wrongdoing of others? Let us think about Jesus Christ and forgive the people who have hurt us. We pray that Jesus Christ will give us this strength through the Holy Spirit.

8th - 14th

As we continue into the week, we remember the period of 64 days where the 12 disciples were hiding out in a building, too afraid to go out and preach without Jesus' support. Lots of us are overjoyed to unroll and say the word **Alleluia**. To start the week, we read a part of the Gospel where Jesus had appeared to his scared disciples and shared with them one last meal. As we end the week, we think about why God sent Jesus and not any other person. During the week, we ask the Lord to keep us out of any peril or dark evil coming our way. Are we ready to walk in the path of Jesus Christ, it is never too late, let us reflect and take a step closer to God by doing an act of good deed towards our neighbours? Lent season is about Praying, Fasting & Almsgiving, let us share a meal or anything useful with those of our fellow beings who are less fortunate.

15th - 21st

During the penultimate week of the month, we start with remembering the Holy Spirit and how God will never ration the gifts of what the Holy Spirit gives. We think about all the fruits of the Holy spirit and especially patience (for the waiting of Pentecost is close) and Kindness (for we have only just been cleansed of our sins and we want to make a start by only doing the good in us). We end the week with a reading in which Jesus says that he will not reject anyone who comes to him and his will is only to do God's bidding and no one else's. As we think about that reading, we understand that Jesus is an indispensable person the Christianity has and that we must try to be as humble as him. Let us effectively use the gifts of Holy Spirit in our daily life towards our fellow beings.

22nd- 30th

We come to the end of the third week of Easter. We think about Jesus' words when he said "You come closer to God everyday for it is Him who called you to come". Reflecting on it we understand that Jesu is repeating God's words, written down by the Prophet Isaiah ' **I have called you by your name ; you are mine**'. When we come towards the end of the 4th week of Easter we hear Jesus as he says, that in his Father's house there are many places to dwell. To end the month, we hear Jesus say that we believe in him to believe in the father. As a prayer to end April, we say; **Thank you** for looking on us during the month, **Sorry** if we hurt you in any way, **Please** give us the courage and strength to face the rest of the year, Amen. Let us reduce few minutes away from electronic gadgets and sit together as a family spend this time to **Thank God** for all that he has given us and also to **seek forgiveness** for the wrong doings.
